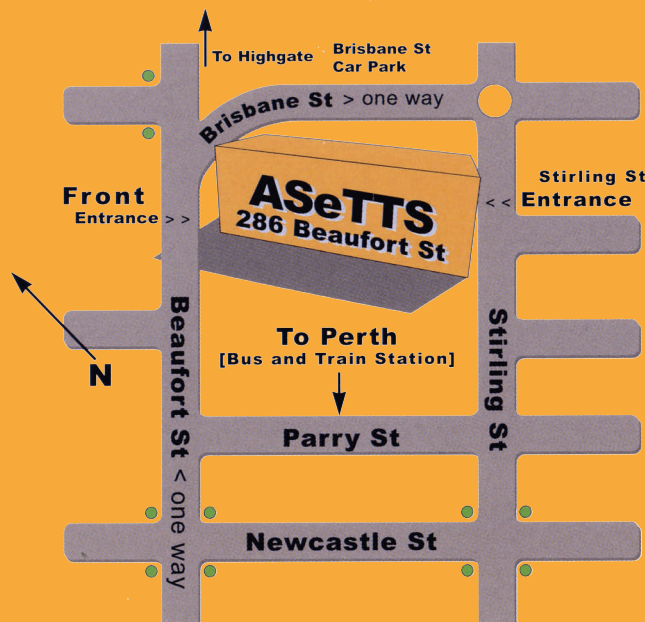


UNITED VOICES

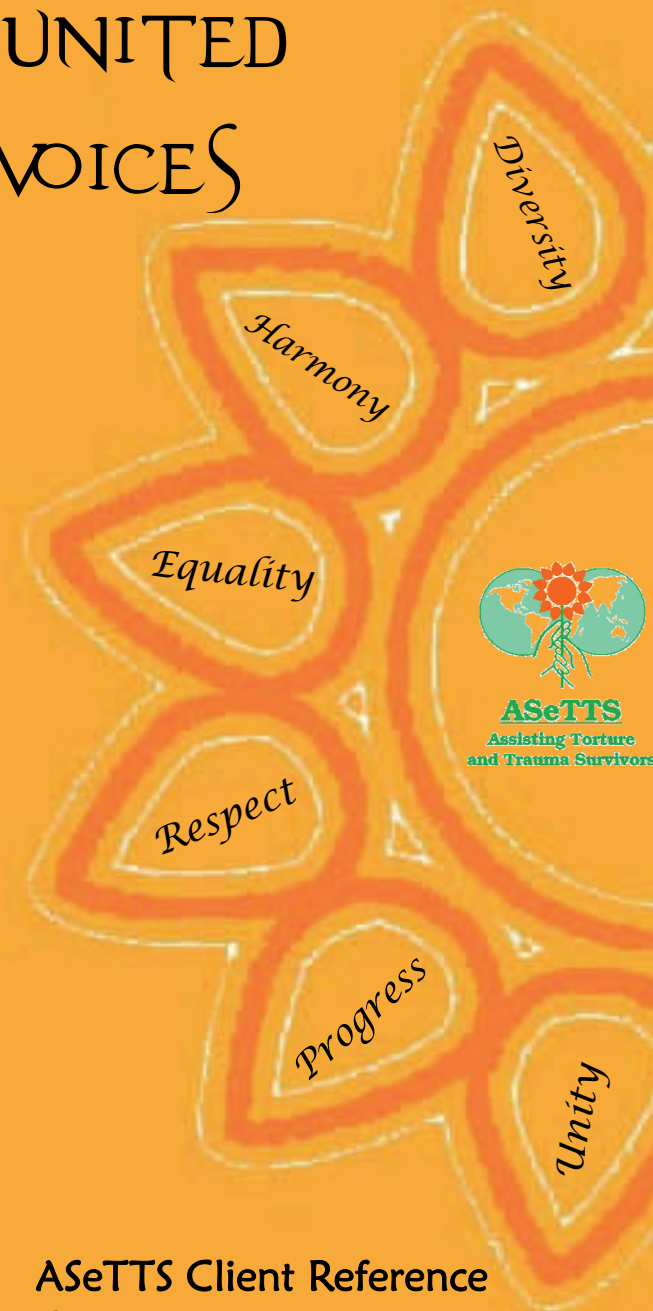
